It is easy to add your "voice" to that of other AAUW members across the United States by becoming a Two-Minute Activist. I, and the members of the Public Policy Committee, strongly encourage you to do so. Remember, there is power in numbers.

Follow these simple steps to become involved.

- 1. Navigate to aauwaction.org
- 2. Click on the "Become a Two Minute Activist" blue button at the end of the page.
- 3. A new page will come up with the option to Sign Up. Click that button.
- 4. On the following page, fill in the form with your contact information and interest and submit.

After signing up, you will begin to receive emails whenever action is requested. The emails may appear with names (Kate Nielson, Robin Lucas, Leticia Tomas) and AAUW Action. Open the email and, if you agree with AAUW's stance on the action, press the Take Action red button.

You may be asked to enter information so that AAUW can determine the appropriate senator and or representative to direct your email. A page will open up with our senators and /or representatives identified and an already-composed is ready to send email. You may personalize the message as much as you wish. End by clicking on Send Message. You are now a Two-Minute Activist!

So far this year, we have been requested to take action on

- The Paycheck Fairness Act to close the gender pay gap
- Raise the Wage Act-raise the minimum wage for federal employees up to \$15/hr by 2025
- Family and Medical Insurance Leave act to provide up to 12 weeks of job-protected, unpaid family leave
- The Equality Act-to protect against gender inequality and preserve LGBTQ rights
- The American Rescue Plan for continued Covid related relief programs
- For The People Act to stop voter suppression and promote voter equality
- Healthy Families Act to insure that full-time employees have the right to 7 paid sick days per year
- The ERA to lift the ERA deadline for ratification






