We will again welcome Mary L. Zupanc, MD, a member of the AAUW National Board of Directors, as our September speaker. This year, her topic will be "The Fascinating History of Women in Medicine." Dr. Zupanc is a professor in the Department of Pediatrics and Neurology at the University of California, Irvine (UCI). She is also the UCI Division Chief of Pediatric Neurology, the Chief Neurology Strategy Officer and the Co-Medical Director of the CHOC Neuroscience Institute. She has published many articles in peer-reviewed journals and has authored several book chapters, particularly on pediatric epilepsy, infantile spasms,

and epilepsy surgery. She has served on the executive board of the Child Neurology Society and is currently on the board of directors for the Child Neurology Foundation. -*Kathryn Brown*
