November Branch Meeting: "Is There Still Hope? The Case for Saving the Planet"

We are pleased to have Judith Ashton and Jan Harvey as our presenters for the November branch meeting.

Judith Ashton is a retired educator. She served as the Dean of Humanities and Social Science at Crafton Hills College and the Chair of the English Department at San Bernardino Valley

College. She previously served on the Human Relations Commission for the City of Redlands and has been involved in other community groups. Judith joined the Citizens Climate Lobby (CCL), East Valley chapter, in 2014. In 2015, she started the Redlands chapter and has served as the chapter leader since its formation to the present. In 2017, Judith was honored with the Citizens of Achievement Award by the League of Women Voters for her work with CCL. Judith has attended five national CCL conferences where she lobbied Congress in support of the Energy Innovation and Carbon Dividend Act.

Jan Harvey is a photographer and printmaker who creates etchings, which she exhibits in various shows and galleries. Pre-COVID, she taught etching through workshops in her studio using a process that safeguards the health of the artist and the planet as it does not use the traditional photo chemicals and acids of the past.

Jan has been involved in protecting the environment most of her life. She joined the local Redlands area CCL chapter about six years ago and has been in charge of outreach activities, such as tabling at community events. She was a member of the Sierra Club and was an activist with Citizens' Action for Peace for over twelve years. Jan was a long-time Girl Scout leader of troops emphasizing hiking, rock climbing, backpacking, and wilderness camping in our mountains and deserts. She, along with her husband and college-age children, built a geodesic dome home in Yucaipa,



which incorporates many passive solar features and other energy-saving and earthfriendly aspects.

ETECH TREK



Tech Trek has been an AAUW CA program for more than 20 years. Prior to 2020, the girls attended a week-long, inperson camp at either Whittier College or UC, San Diego, where they lived in the dorms and worked in the science labs.

This year AAUW Redlands sponsored a total of 11 7th and 8th grade students from Nicolet Middle School in Banning, San Gorgonio Middle School in Beaumont, and Clement Middle School in Redlands. The virtual Tech Trek camp had more than 40 hours of STEM activities, 75% of which was hands-on, including 15 hours of coding. For the second year, Heather Abushanab was an instructor and coach.
