## **Branch STEM Initiatives On Track for 2022**




Plans are now complete to hold in-person, live events for all three of our 2022 Redlands branch-sponsored STEM programs.

### Coco Contreras, CHAT Member, Speaks at Library Event



On November 1, 2021, A. K. Smiley Public celebrated Dia de Los Muertos with the Redlands community. The purpose of Dia de Los Muertos, known also as the Day of the Dead, is to show love and respect for deceased family members and friends. The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) has recognized the importance of Dia de los Muertos by adding the holiday to its list of Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity.

Coco Contreras, a member of the AAUW-sponsored Conversation Helps Adults Transition (CHAT), was a keynote speaker at the library event. Coco explained the history of this originally Aztec-Mexican holiday and the symbolic meaning of items that are included in the ofrendas (home altars), including marigolds whose scent brings the dead into the world of the living, tissue flowers to remind us of the fragility of life, and placement of favorite foods and beverages for the departed.

Coco and her friend Sandy Godoy, a fellow-CHAT member, prepared an ofrenda for the CHAT community. They also decorated the entire Contemporary Club auditorium, creating a beautiful and educational environment for the evening. AAUW

member and Board Trustee, Dr. Rosa Gomez, served as chair for the evening, which included remarks by Mayor Pro-Tem Eddie Tejeda and Councilmember Jenna Guzman-Lowery. Rosa was interviewed by Channel 4, and she explained the importance of Dia de los Muertos in honoring loved ones who have passed.

We congratulate Coco, who shared her remarks in English and Spanish. The CHAT program currently includes over 30 chattees (women who want to improve their conversational English) from over ten countries. We welcome AAUW volunteers who want to help adults in our community improve their conversational English.


