

The Tech Trek Committee needs Additional Volunteers for this Coming Year

Tech Trek is getting organized to begin the camper selection process in January. We offer both Tech Trek residential and virtual STEM Camps. Selection starts with getting nominations from the 7th grade STEM teachers at the four Middle Schools we work with, in Banning, Beaumont, Yucaipa and Redlands. We work closely with the counselors and teachers at each school. Once the nominations are submitted into CampDoc (our current software program), we focus on getting the girls and their parents to complete their applications, which includes the applicant's essay. We then read and score the applications and essays and teacher nominations and select qualifying candidates for interviews. We select the final campers receiving scholarships based on

- 1. the number of candidates we have been approved for by AAUW State, which depends on space available and demand
- 2. funds available that year from donations, which are approved by the AAUW Redlands STEM committee and the board
- 3. scoring based on criteria set by AAUW national
 This process starts in December and is hopefully completed before the Spring Break in April.

We have found that having 2-3 volunteers working with teachers, counselors, and parents at each school as a team has worked well. We hope that some of you might be interested in joining our Tech Trek Committee this year. We need more volunteers. Our branch pays 100% of the cost of the STEM camps. The current cost is \$1100 for a week at a residential camp and \$500 for a week at Virtual Camp. We exceeded our goal of sending 12 girls to camp this year to celebrate Tech Trek's 25th Anniversary and sent 14 girls. They all had a wonderful experience as you saw in last month's newsletter if you read the quotes from their Thank You notes. Thank you all for your support last year. We look forward to your continued support and another great Tech Trek year.
