

Gov Trek

Gov Trek is a statewide program developed by AAUW California for junior and senior high school girls to expose them to careers in public service and elected office. Starting in January and conducted through five virtual two-hour sessions, the activities will be engaging, interactive, and inspirational.

Want more women in political power?

Learn about the AAUW program Gov Trek!

AAUW Redlands is again inviting high school junior and senior girls to take part in a free online program called Gov Trek, offered by AAUW-



California. Gov Trek is designed to encourage young women to consider careers in government, whether as elected leaders or in appointed positions.

Gov Trek is conducted over Zoom, in seven, twohour sessions where girls from all over California will hear from women legislators, campaign experts and others in public service. The girls will then work in teams to simulate a political campaign, culminating in a competition with an award for the best team.

The girls will all get opportunities for internships, shadowing, and other activities in the year following Gov Trek to give them hands-on experience in public sector careers. The program starts February 3rd and runs through March 16th, on consecutive Saturdays.

If you have a daughter or granddaughter who is a high school junior or senior, please encourage her to sign up for Gov Trek. We want our region to be well-represented in the upcoming Gov Trek program. If you belong to a service club in the East San Bernardino Valley or San Gorgonio Pass area, please ask to speak briefly at its next meeting to spread the word about Gov Trek. All of us are needed to help recruit girls for this excellent opportunity.

AAUW California Scorecard for the 2023 California Legislative Session

So how did AAUW California's priority legislation fare? Pretty well, overall!

Of our 40 pieces of priority legislation, 19 were signed into law, 3 were vetoed, and 18 were transitioned into two-year bills (meaning they will be raised again in 2024).

Twenty-two pieces of our priority legislation made it to the governor's desk. With 19 out of those 22 pieces of legislation signed into law, we achieved an 86.3% success rate.

One of our highest priority level bills (level A), which we co-sponsored, was signed into law: AB 1394. This bill seeks to help child sex abuse survivors remove their images from social media platforms, holding big tech accountable for design features that knowingly, recklessly or negligently facilitate, aid or abet child exploitation. ~continued on https://www.aauw-ca.org/public-policy/




Redlands STEM Conference

What is Tech Trek? Through hands-on problem solving and encounters with women role models in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM), AAUW Tech Trek helps girls see their futures while having non-stop fun.





We will continue to have the week-long Virtual Tech Trek Stem camp for campers who are more comfortable working from home.

Our branch Tech Trek Committee met for a pre-planning session, late October, and we are busy preparing marketing materials for the schools and for fundraising. We currently work with one school in each district that we serve: Redlands, Beaumont, Banning & Yucaipa/Calimesa. In January the TechTrek team will move forward with plans to review applications and interview 7th Grade girls for placement at the week-long AAUW CA sponsored 2024 residential summer camps. Our goal for this year is to be able to send 12 girls to camp from the four schools. How many girls are accepted depends on the number of reservations AAUW Redlands is allocated and fundraising.
