A few familiar faces have joined or rejoined our Redlands branch. Thanks for affirming your commitment to AAUW Redlands and our mission to advance equity for women and girls!


Connie Binkley BA from CSUSD, MA from University of Redlands.

Explaining the Legal Advocacy Fund What does it Mean to Us?

As I talk to branch members, I realize that many do not know of the work of the Legal Advocacy Fund. Perhaps it is because the LAF is an AAUW National initiative, not a state or branch initiative, and therefore its work, and successes seem remote. But, in fact, the resolution of at least two of the cases supported by the LAF

have resulted in establishing legal precedence. Or, perhaps, you are new to AAUW and have never heard of the Legal Advocacy Fund. So let me explain the LAF and its mission.

In 1978, a fund was established by the Ithaca NY branch of AAUW to provide monetary support to 11 Cornell University female faculty members who were suing the University for wage discrimination. The branch members believed it was important that these plaintiffs have funds for the many expenses incurred when involved in a lawsuit-not just legal fees. Therefore, the branch established a fund and collected money in support of the professors. The fund was so successful that when presented at the 1981 AAUW National Convention, the Legal Advocacy Fund was established as a national AAUW initiative.

Funds continued to be granted only to plaintiffs bringing lawsuits against academic institutions until 2009 when the mission was expanded to provide funds to women suing any workplace for gender discrimination and/or wage discrimination. Since 1972, the majority of cases revolve around violation of Title IX regulations. Each year, \$100,000 may be designated for grants to eligible plaintiffs. The LAF has supported dozens of cases over the many years of its existence and is currently supporting 8 active cases.

LAF continues to expand its scope and now provides grants ranging from \$20,000 to \$50,000 per year to law schools in New York and California conducting legal clinics that advance gender equity. Two law schools are receiving grants currently.

I hope by knowing the story of the Legal Advocacy Fund-its mission and its history-that you will be moved to donate to and support it. It is my sincere belief that LAF does important work with possible national impact. Donations can be made online at the AAUW national website. LAF falls under the Economic Security Fund, #4449. Or a check can be written to AAUW Funds designating 4449 in the comments section and mailed or handed to our Treasurer at a branch meeting.

Great News for Student Members!


