

President's Corner: Heather Abushanab



The election is finally over and we are moving into a transition period before the new administration takes office. No matter who you supported in the election, the work and priorities of AAUW, AAUW CA and AAUW Redlands branch remain the same. We are dedicated to advancing equity for women and girls through education, empowerment, and advocacy.

AAUW and AAUW CA work on our behalf in both Washington DC and Sacramento. Twenty-five of 29 bills that aligned with the <u>AAUW CA Public Policy priorities</u> were signed into law by Governor Newsom. These bills included support for rape victims, transparency requirements on Title IX for our public colleges, and protections for health care providers and their patients. You can see the bills that AAUW CA is currently tracking in their <u>tracking report</u>. On November 19th, AAUW hosted a webinar discussing women's economic security, including key issues like pay equity, family leave, and affordable quality childcare in the light of the new administration's likely policy agenda. If you missed this presentation, you will be able to find a recording here. You can find many other interesting AAUW presentations in the webinar list on the AAUW website.

Locally, we are very proud of our public policy committee under the leadership of Cassie MacDuff. This fall, in collaboration with the University of Redlands Public Policy program we hosted two well-attended candidate forums, one for Redlands City Council and one for the RUSD School Board. All the candidates for office accepted the invitation to participate. One candidate had to withdraw due to illness. Those that participated were grateful for the opportunity to discuss our local issues and their plans for our community. They also hosted a forum for CA state representatives ahead of the primary election this past spring. These types of events are vital for the health of our local government.

In the spring, public policy committee members will participate in Lobby Days, an opportunity to meet directly with those who represent our area in state and national government. — *continued on page 3*

Largest Audience Yet for AAUW Candidate Forums





On October 10, AAUW Redlands' city council candidate forum drew the largest audience yet, more than 125 people, of the five forums it has offered to the public over the past six years. It was held in the Casa Loma Room at the University of Redlands.

Redlands City Council District 2 candidates Jennifer Maravillas and Eddie Tejeda, and District 4 candidates Jenna Guzman-Lowery and Marc Shaw, answered questions from a panel of moderators and the audience. (District 4 candidate Jesus Cisneros emailed shortly before the event that he would not attend because his family was recovering from Covid.)

Questions included what the city should do to address the homelessness crisis, how to address the need for more affordable housing and whether or not more warehouses should be built in Redlands.

The panel of moderators included U of R Public Policy Program director Dr. Renee Van Vechten, and U of R professor emerita of economics, Dr. Dorene Isenberg, and AAUW Redlands Public Policy Committee chair Cassie MacDuff.

Past president Sheron Bealer served as emcee; past president Patty Ahearn served as timer, assisted by Toastmasters expert Suzanne Leonard; and Kathryn Brown staffed the Q&A table to collect audience questions on 3x5 cards, assisted by Kay Dobbertin.

Kay also printed the nameplates to identify the candidates on the dais, and Sheron gathered the AAUW logo banner, table cloth and signs to post to display identifying our branch as the sponsor of the debate, along with the university.

A special thank you this evening to Keita Wangari, who handled social media. Without her work, we would not have attracted as many members of the Redlands community as we did.

Many thanks to Dr. Van Vechten and the university for securing the room and providing it for free, so the public could attend without charge.


