# September Branch Meeting: Thelma Muro



Theme park designer and AAUW Redlands branch member Thelma Muro will speak on "Worlds Within Worlds: The Magic of Immersive Theme Park Design" for the September branch meeting program.

Muro's background includes working both as an architect for traditional architecture firms and as project manager for private/public redevelopment partnerships before she decided to form her own company, Thelma & Boom, Inc. As principal and

founder, she is involved in all aspects of design, technical development and often lends her talents to major theme park development groups as project director, overseeing teams of hundreds of designers, engineers, and other specialty consultants during the years of design required to design a successful theme park.

Muro's credentials are impressive: she's led or been part of the design team of numerous immersive experiences and theme parks, including "Warner Bros World" in Abu Dhabi, UAE (based on Warner Bros comics and cartoons and the world's largest indoor theme park), "The Wizarding World of Harry Potter" at Universal Studios Hollywood, "Yokohama Oceanarium" in Yokohama, Japan (featuring an experiential, educational, immersive "Journey Through Time"), and the "Cirque du Soleil Theme and Water Park" in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico (a design inspired by the experiential, otherworldly visual style for which Cirque du Soleil is famous).

Muro will talk about the creative and logistical process of managing multiple teams of artists and experts who contribute diverse, inspired ideas and ultimately making an imagined world come alive.

What is AAUW Redlands doing? Driven by a revised 2025-26 strategic plan, together we will:

- Expand our college and university partnerships and community fundraising efforts over the next four years to increase the annual number of National Conference of College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL) scholarships given to female students at our partner schools.
- Fine-tune our Nancy Yowell Memorial Scholarship criteria and processes to expand our reach and ensure we select the most deserving and high-potential applicants returning to a post-secondary education.
- Invest in our branch's leadership and future leaders through improved financial literacy and Microsoft 365 Teams training, Leadership Redlands support, better documentation of leader responsibilities for easier role transitions, and targeted growth opportunities for our Members at Large.
- Support and educate our local communities about the risks of censorship of curricula and libraries in local public schools, advocate for diversity programs, support our professional educators, and advocate for protections of LGBTQ+ and women's rights.

You'll hear more about each of these efforts throughout the year.

### And what are our recent AAUW Redlands results?

- Unafraid of potential changes in this past year's NCCWSL format, we didn't shy away or hold back. No, we sent two deserving Crafton Hills College students to participate. At our September branch meeting you'll hear first-hand about their NCCWSL experiences this past summer. You won't want to miss their recap!
- In 2024-25 we raised over \$3700 to support higher education for women returning to college after an educational interruption. These are engaged, smart, persistent women intent on bettering their lives.
- We sent 647 middle school students to our STEM Conferences and Tech Trek camps, exposing them to imaginative and exciting careers with higher earning potential, opportunities for innovation, and a chance to make a significant impact on society.

She also told us that she had joined the Civil Air Patrol Cadet program--which focuses on aerospace education, emergency services and drill-- and had been selected to attend the week-

long "Encampment" (a challenging, military-type training experience for cadets) at Camp Roberts in San Luis Obispo. She asked if AAUW Redlands would be willing to cover the \$475 camp fee, and after due consideration, the board voted to grant her request.

Good morning,

I hope you're doing well! This is Aarya Wani, and I wanted to share an update on my experiences at Encampment and as a Build Coach for the virtual Tech Trek.

First of all, I want to thank AAUW Redlands for giving me the opportunity to attend Encampment. It was one of the most challenging and most valuable experiences of my life. One of my highlights was getting to fly in a C-47, which was so fun! I was constantly pushed out of my comfort zone, and faced a lot of mental and physical challenges, and came out stronger and more

confident. I really feel that I've grown as a leader and a team member.

Two weeks ago, I also had the chance to be a Build Coach for the virtual Tech Trek camp. I had so much fun working with the campers! Our team's sustainable development goal was "no poverty," and it was exciting to watch the campers grow and improve their projects every day. By the end of the week I was so proud to see their working inventions. It was also an amazing opportunity to work with the other coaches, who were able to give me great advice and mentorship. Honestly, by teaching them, I feel like I have a much better understanding of coding and circuitry.

To conclude, thank you so much to AAUW Redlands for supporting both of these amazing opportunities. I'm really grateful for everything

you've helped make possible.




